


OUR FUNDRAISING

This event was created and is supported by Community First Foundation and FirstBank. We were thrilled to see individuals and longtime supporters engage in the event to support EFS.



OUR VOLUNTEERS

The foundation maintains close contact with our community to inform about opportunities to volunteer in Summit School District classrooms and to participate in the activities of the foundation. EFS relies on our volunteers to help with Trivia Night, reading projects at the schools, including helping at Author Visits and sorting incoming book shipments for Summit Books for Kids.

This year, volunteering was limited as we continued to take precautions against spreading COVID. EFS volunteers helped where they could, such helping with Summit Books for Kids and reviewing scholarship applications.




OUR IMPACT

Over \$900,000 has been raised by EFS since 2010 through contributions from our generous community, grants, partnerships with parent-teacher organizations, and fundraising.

In 2021, the foundation raised \$93,145 and 80% of all the funds raised went directly to the schools to support teachers and students of the Summit School District:

- \$52,000 for Eileen Finkel Innovative Teacher Awards
- \$500 for STEAM
- \$7,543 for Innovative Reading programs
- \$2,715 for Partnerships for Education
- \$12,565 in Senior Scholarships for Summit High School and Snowy Peaks High School



EILEEN FINKEL INNOVATIVE TEACHER AWARDS

With help from the Eileen Finkel Innovative Teacher Awards, students will be growing vegetables, building virtual worlds, welcoming the zoo to their school, playing with sand and tools while learning STEM, and learning how to custom-mold ski boots. These are just a few examples of teachers' creative ideas funded by the Education Foundation of the Summit, in partnership with each schools' parent-teacher organizations. The teacher grants have funded teachers' ideas since 2011.

Hollyanna Bates, Dillon Valley Elementary (DVE) first grade teacher, requested funds to bring the Cheyenne Zoo to her students. The visit is tailored to curriculum standards for the Feathers, Scales and Fur unit. Students can touch the animals that are part of the presentation. "Many of our students have not visited a zoo and this grant provides a close-up experience with animals they have never seen," Hollyanna said.


Kendra Carpenter, DVE principal, is expanding usage of video equipment funded last year from the grant. Kendra requested equipment for remote learning to amplify teachers' voices while streaming classes to students at home, as well as webcams to increase visibility of the whiteboard. She reported that quality video helped students' engagement when they were learning from home. DVE continues to use the technology to support teacher professional development.

During the pandemic, many requests revolve around remote and physically-distanced learning. Bonnie Ward, vice chairperson of Education Foundation of the Summit (EFS), said "We've been impressed with the resilience and flexibility of teachers as they continue adapting to new learning environments."

EILEEN FINKEL INNOVATIVE TEACHER AWARDS

The awards are typically presented to teachers by several EFS directors, the PTA president, and the principal during a brief visit to their classroom. "It's always a mini-celebration when we present the awards. The teachers are so appreciative and they really deserve the recognition," said Paul Finkel, EFS director.

Each fall, teachers request support for their innovative and creative ideas from EFS through the Eileen Finkel Innovative Teacher Awards. Principals and PTA presidents, while helping review requests, will add on other support such as volunteers from the parent-teacher organizations or materials the principal can provide. The awards are made possible through parent-teacher organizations at each school and other generous sponsors.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The **Snowy Peaks High School Scholarship** was established in 2016 with a donation from the F Cubed Foundation. The Scholarship Program is an important part of EFS's support of this innovative junior and senior high school. Snowy Peaks has a 100% graduation rate, and each of those graduates receive a scholarship from EFS.

Scholarships are awarded to **Summit High School seniors**, many of whom will be the first in their family to attend college. EFS directors also serve as mentors to high school students in the Pre-Collegiate Program that serves first generation college students. This scholarship program, in place since 2012, is made possible by our annual fundraising and generous local donors.

Lewark Family Scholarship

The Lewark Family Scholarship awards \$1,000 in honor of Ron Lewark to an SHS graduate heading to technical school. Ron Lewark came to Frisco in 1971 and purchased the Texaco, and along with his wife Donna, ran it. Jeff and Larry helped out as they grew up. Ron was a car enthusiast, private pilot, and enjoyed jeeping and snowmobiling. He passed in 2018. Jeff and Scarlett, Larry and Laura, and their children are Summit High School graduates.

Kerry's Kids Scholarship

This scholarship fund was created in honor of long-time educator and retired superintendent Kerry Buhler. As Superintendent, her priorities included implementing more collaboration and planning time for teachers, improving technology infrastructure and overseeing an extensive master facilities planning process that involved major expansions and additions to several district schools. Kerry was the engine behind some of the district's most innovative reforms, such as piloting the International Baccalaureate's program for all elementary schools and building a student-led, grassroots movement for sustainable, environmentally friendly practices. Kerry came to the Superintendent role after 13 years as principal of Upper Blue Elementary, and before that, she taught first and second grades for more than 7 years.

Roaring Summit Valley Scholarship

Joel Gomez is a Summit High School alum and graduated from the Colorado School of Mines in May 2020. He and three friends created the scholarship to award \$500 to two students graduating from their alma maters who will be pursuing a college degree in science, technology, engineering, mathematics, or education.



The biggest help I had in achieving this dream was the financial support. Our scholarship isn't very big, but I know that everything makes a difference."

Joel and his friends (two from Valley HS and one from Roaring Fork HS) award the scholarship to students who have a passion and work ethic to pursue STEM.

INDOVATIVE READING



Innovative Reading supports the Annual Author Visits and Summit Books for Kids.

The Annual Author Visit is made possible through our generous partners. This year the poet Jovan Mays made a virtual visit to help Summit Middle School kick off the poetry unit and Poetry Slam. He also visited Summit High School's Winter Arts Festival to give a poetry reading.

Summit Books for Kids increases access to books for children whose families do not have the means to purchase books. The identified children are able to purchase two books each month with their teacher's help. This program increases access to highly relevant, engaging books for children. Developing lifelong readers requires a systems approach to helping children acquire behaviors that support literacy: reading for pleasure, reading a series, knowing favorite authors, and having books of their own at home. The number of books in a child's home is highly correlated to their literacy success, both in the short term and the long term, as they develop into lifelong readers.

Eileen Finkel Innovative Teacher grants are awarded in partnership with the parentteacher organizations of all nine schools.


The foundation offers grant writing assistance and provides matching grants up to \$500 to parent-teacher organizations at each school to support their school-based initiatives.


